COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY HELD MAY 10

Lake Area Technical College held its 57th Annual Commencement Ceremony on Friday, May 10, at the Civic Arena in Watertown, SD. The class of 2024 included 806 graduates completing their certificates, diplomas, or degrees in 31 programs of study.

South Dakota State Representative Will Mortenson delivered the commencement address to a full house of nearly 5,000 family members, guests, and graduates. In his message, he congratulated the graduates on reaching this milestone and encouraged them to go out and be builders and makers in their pursuit of the American Dream.

This year, Lake Area Tech College 2024 graduates represented 57 South Dakota counties, 15 states, and three countries. Amongst the graduates, 17 were veterans and 76 were from military-connected families. They were part of a cohort that completed 103,977 community service and service learning hours and 75% were employed while attending school.

During the ceremony, Lake Area Technical College recognized five retirees: Chris Barrett, Physical Therapist Assistant program instructor and supervisor; Randy Carl, Building Trades Technology instructor; Kris Lindahl, Medical Assisting instructor and supervisor; Gary Mudder, Precision Machining instructor; and Marie Palluck, Business instructor. Together they dedicated 101 years of service to Lake Area Technical College.




LATC RETIREES GATHERING!

DENTAL HYGIENE PROGRAM

Lake Area Technical College (LATC) is set to expand its renowned healthcare education offerings with the approval of a new Associate of Applied Science (AAS) program in Dental Hygiene to begin fall 2025. This initiative marks a significant milestone for the college, which was the first and only in the state to successfully operate and maintain a CODA-accredited Dental Assisting program for 56 years.

The approval of the Dental Hygiene program comes as a response to the growing demand for skilled dental hygienists in the region. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics and Lightcast, the employment of dental hygienists (in South Dakota) is projected to grow 6.9 percent from 2023 to 2033, faster than the average for all occupations. When upcoming retirements and natural job turnover is factored in, there will be a 13.61% increase in employment of dental hygienists in South Dakota between 2020-2030 (Bureau of Labor Statistics).

Nicole Pahl, director of the Dental Assisting program, expressed her enthusiasm for the new program, "The addition of the Dental Hygiene program aligns with our mission to provide a superior, comprehensive technical education that meets the needs of our community and industry partners. Our long-standing success in Dental Assisting has paved the way for this new endeavor, and we are committed to upholding the same standards of excellence."

LATC's Dental Assisting program, a cornerstone of the college's healthcare education, will operate as the first step for the new Dental Hygiene program. The Dental Assisting program has a storied history of preparing students for successful careers, with a curriculum that emphasizes both the clinical and administrative aspects of dental care. The Dental Hygiene program will be the second step if students choose to continue their education after completing the Dental Assisting program. The program will uphold the high standards of LATC and the profession, by providing curriculum that utilizes the newly renovated "state of

art" LATC Dental Clinic. The clinic facilities include 14 simulation stations for pre-clinic skills and 10 dental operatories with Nitrous Oxide, radiography equipment, a sterilization center and a full dental laboratory.

The Dental Hygiene curriculum will equip students with the elevated theoretical knowledge and practical skills required of a dental hygienist. Once the student successfully completes the Dental Assisting AAS degree, they can apply to continue for an additional year of instruction to obtain their Dental Hygiene AAS degree. The program will comprise of comprehensive curriculum, including advanced oral anatomy, periodontology, preventative dental health, radiography, instrumentation, ethical conduct and community dental health issues. Students will also gain handson experience through clinical rotations, allowing them to apply their learning in real-world settings under the supervision of local experienced professionals.

The 1 + 1 design of the Dental Hygiene AAS degree is unique. Dental Hygiene graduates from LATC will earn two degrees, an AAS in Dental Assisting and an AAS in Dental Hygiene, in only three years. Furthermore, our graduates will be more flexible in their job role by providing both dental assisting and dental hygiene skills.

The introduction of the Dental Hygiene program is expected to have a positive impact on the local community as well. By training more dental hygienists, LATC aims to improve access to dental care, LATC will be working to establish and maintain partnerships with area dentists to accommodate students' clinical hours and skills. Applications for the Dental Hygiene program will be accepted beginning fall of 2024 with the first cohort set to begin classes in fall of 2025.

- 12. The Electronic Systems Technology and Robotics programs entered two teams in the Autonomous Snow Plow competition in Minneapolis!





LAKE AREA TECH EARNS **TOP 10 MILITARY FRIENDLY®** SCHOOL DESIGNATION

Lake Area Technical College has achieved the prestigious 2024-2025 Military Friendly® Top 10 School designation among similar-sized two-year colleges across the country. This accomplishment marks the 14th year that Lake Area Tech has received the esteemed Military Friendly® School award, and for the first time, it secured Top 10 status.

The designation is recognition for Lake Area Tech having meaningful and sustained education paths for the military community. The college is currently serving 107 militaryconnected students. Twenty-one Lake Area Technical College employees are veterans or actively serving in the guard or reserves.

"I am proud that Lake Area Tech is once again recognized as being a top Military Friendly® school in the nation," said Lake Area Technical College President Tiffany Sanderson. "This designation reflects the appreciation we have for our service men and women as they pursue their educational and career aspirations."

Lake Area Tech has a dedicated Veteran Services office designed to support military students. The office representatives work one-on-one with military members to ensure their transition from military life to student life is as seamless as possible. Lake Area Tech's military-friendly community provides a solid foundation for employment in today's high-demand fields.

Institutions earning the Military Friendly® School designation were evaluated on data related to success in student retention, graduation, career placement, loan repayment, educational persistence (degree advancement or transfer), and loan default rates for all students and, specifically, for student veterans. More than 1,800 schools participated in the 2024-2025 survey with 537 earning special awards for going above the standard.

HALL NAMED TO **AOTA'S ROSTER OF HONOR**



Lake Area Tech's Occupational Therapy Assistant Instructor, Kory Hall (MA, BA, COTA/L), was honored with a spot on the esteemed American Occupational Therapy Association Roster of Honor. This recognition took place at the 2024 Annual Conference & Expo in Orlando, Florida, in March.

The Roster of Honor recognizes occupational therapy assistants who through their knowledge, expertise, leadership, advocacy, and/or guidance have made a significant contribution over time to the profession with a measured impact on consumers of occupational therapy services and/or members of the Association, according to the AOTA website. Kory's many contributions include the establishment of the Sensory Adventures Camp in 2013, which she continues to enhance for children with sensory impairment in the Watertown area. The establishment of the camp was an innovative approach to the Occupational Therapy Assistant student level 1 fieldwork at Lake Area Tech.

LATC Occupational Therapy Assistant Department Supervisor Julie Kalahar commented, "I have witnessed many of the exceptional tasks and creative ideas Kory has implemented through the years. She has made an enormous impact on the future of the occupational therapy practice as a role model to the OTA students; however, her impact has reached much farther than the students in her classroom. Kory has reached her community and other professionals."

A 2001 graduate of the Lake Area Tech Occupational Therapist Assistant program, Kory continued her formal education by earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in 2005 from Mount Marty University in Allied Health Diagnostic, Intervention, and Treatment Professions. In 2008, she began her position as an instructor and Academic Fieldwork Coordinator at Lake Area Tech. Currently, she is pursuing her Master of Science degree in Interdisciplinary Studies from South Dakota State University. She has also been highly involved in the state and national Occupational Therapy Association and regularly participates in professional educational programs.
